# WHO WE ARE

Zamzam Foundation exists to improve the lives of vulnerable people affected by human and natural disasters and other threats to their well-being. We began our work in Mogadishu, Somalia in 1992 as a non-governmental, not-for-profit humanitarian and development charity soon after the collapse of the Federal Government of Somalia which coincided with a severe drought that affected millions of Somalis. Since then, we have grown to become the largest national humanitarian and development organization in Somalia with almost three decades of experience providing relief and socio-economic support services to those most affected by the joint forces of conflict, war and recurrent climatic shocks. Our organization's headquarters are in Mogadishu, with field operation offices across the country and international offices in Kenya and Turkey.


Our programs are focused on serving the most vulnerable and marginalised people in the Horn of Africa - children, adolescent boys and girls, women, persons with special needs, and other marginalized groups and internally displaced persons (IDPs). The sectors we work in are humanitarian relief, health care, education, orphan and childcare, economic development and sustainable livelihood, water and sanitation as well as peace-building and governance.





# **EDUCATION**

Zamzam Foundation is dedicated to providing excellence in all aspects of education, from physical infrastructures to school curricula. We renovate old and abandoned schools and also build new schools from the ground up. Our dedicated staff in all regions operate and manage schools, c ontinuing education learning centers, cultural institutions and the two branches of Zamzam University of Science & Technology in Mogadishu and Baidoa.


The educational system in Somalia is still recovering from the destruction that ensued after the collapse of the central Somali government in 1991.

Education is at the heart of Zamzam Foundation's activities as we believe that Education is the solution to many of Somalia's woes and the most important means of overcoming poverty.



Zamzam Foundation oversees more than a dozen schools in Banadir, Bay, Lower Shabelle, Middle Shabelle and Hiran in Somalia. We build, equip and maintain community training schools. We have constructed more than thirty-five schools and two branches of Zamzam university.

We build, equip and maintain community training schools. Schools are spread across Mogadishu, Bay, Middle Shabelle, Lower Shabelle, Hiraan, Galgaduud, Mudug, Bari and Hargeisa in Somaliland.








Tens of thousands of students graduated from our secondary schools. Most students pay a nominal monthly fee to cover some expenses. Zamzam Foundation and contributions from individual donors pay fees to children from low-income families and orphans.

A total of 2,338 students graduated from Zamzam schools in 2018

\*Zamzam takes care of the education and all aspects of the livelihood of orphans, whether they are enrolled in day school or boarding.





The Program provides access to clean water and instills good hygiene practices by drilling and rehabilitating boreholes and artesian and shallow water wells running activities relating to good hygiene practices in health posts and MCHCs throughout Somalia in partnership with different aid agencies, Zamzam Foundation dug wells that benefitted a total of about 290,000 people.

Water is a very precious and scarce resource in Somalia and plays a critical role in the lives of the people. This is especially true of nomadic and farming communities in isolated and small villages. Inadequate access to water, lack of sanitation and poor hygiene have helped to accelerate the increasing rate of disease in Somalia.

Millions of Somalis suffer from the effects of human and natural disasters. The combination of conflict, political instability, displacement and changing climate conditions continue to put immense pressures on access to basic health services for many Somalis, especially women, girls, children, elders, persons with disabilities and those living in IDP settlements. Resulting food insecurity, lack of clean water, poor hygiene and sanitation, disease and the loss of income thus feed into the vicious cycle of poverty.






To encourage self-sufficiency and sustainable livelihoods and stimulate the economy, Zamzam Foundation provides heavy machinery, cattle and seeds, agricultural/livestock products and training to farmers. We support hundreds of families living in poverty by providing them with small-scale means of income generation such as sewing machines, dairy cows, capital for start-ups and SMEs (small and medium-sized businesses), as well as technical and marketing support.

Farmers receive seeds, farm tools, heavy equipment and cows as well as support for land preparation and canalization. In 2018, continuous training was also provided to farmers, which included the idea of forming cooperatives, to improve their farming methods and improve yield.





Zamzam Foundation runs the Community Resources Management (CRM) Project (Phase) which is a community-led, local peace-building initiative directed towards strengthening state-building mechanisms in Somalia in three regions: Hiraan, Galgaduud and Middle Shabelle. This project lays a stable foundation for the peace and state-building process, focusing on community-based reconciliation processes that restore trust between communities and addresses root causes of conflict, amongst them unresolved, long-standing grievances.



Community dialogues engaging all the stakeholders in Galmudhug – regional authorities, local administrations, of Balanbale and Guriceel, elders of opposing clans, youth, women's groups, the business communities and the religious leaders from both communities –culminated with a peace conference organized by Zamzam Foundation and held in Balanbale on January 31st to February 6th 2018. 200 delegates were invited (100 from each clan).







Zamzam Foundation has numerous projects that come under Social Services and Protection, including Orphan Care & Sponsorship, Ramadan and Udhiyyah.

# ORPHAN CARE AND SPONSORSHIP

In 2018, Zamzam Foundation had under its care 9,043 orphans who were eligible for income as well as material support.

Zamzam's orphan care and sponsorship supports orphans in the regions of Banadir, Middle Shabelle, Lower Shabelle, Hiraan, Bay and Somaliland. Support services provided to orphans are many and include free homes, childcare, education, meals, annual health checks ups, cash disbursements, games and entertainment.


